





Situated on one of the world's most stunning coastlines, the former whaling town of Victor Harbor is a relaxed seaside retreat with a historic main street and a coastline dominated by a huge rock outcrop called the Bluff. Offshore is Granite Island, connected to Victor Harbor by a causeway, strewn with giant granite boulders and home to a colony of penguins.

Things to do and activities abound when you stay in Victor Harbor. Ride the iconic Horse Drawn Tram across to Granite Island; catch one of the heritage Steamranger trains that travel along the scenic coastline; investigate the South Australian Whale Centre and the Encounter Coast Discovery Centre.

There was a wide variety of cars on show, among them were Rolls Royce, Ferrari, Bentley, Jaguar, Mercedes Benz, Rovers, Morgans and others.













#### For Rover 75 Owners

Is your Traction Control Unit Warning light on and won't go off. It means there is a fault in your Traction Control Unit. Up till now the only way to fix it was to replace the entire unit with a new one or a good second hand one. Both options are expensive.

Most faults are caused by a broken tooth in the main cog that connects the unit to the ABS system. The unit is located in the engine bay on the firewall in front of the driver.

Now thanks to technology and 3D printing we have a simple solution. From South Aust

#### Rover 75 Traction Control Unit.

Rover 75 owners may be interested in a possible solution to the failure of traction control units due to a chipped tooth in a <u>plastic</u> cog contained therein.

A gentleman residing in Strathalbyn, SA, has succeeded in producing a replacement cog on his 3D printer. Once again it is in plastic (ABS) but he is making them available at \$16 each plus postage and is happy to negotiate a discount for quantities of 4+. At that price I reckon carrying a spare, even another plastic one is good insurance.

Thet picture below shows the new cog on the left, next to a (failed) original. Note the missing tooth on the old cog immediately after the reinforcing bar at the 'twenty past'. The right picture shows the elevation view of the two cogs.
